Dear Ms Post,

We are writing to you following your note to First Vice-President TIMMERMANS and Commissioner OETTINGER of 22 August 2018.

We understand that you wish to challenge the disciplinary decision adopted against you by the tripartite Appointing Authority.

As you were informed by the Director of IDOC, Karen WILLIAMS, on 17 July 2018 and by Unit HR.E.2 "Appeals and Case Monitoring" on 10 August 2018, you have the possibility to lodge a complaint against the sanction decision, by using the procedure provided for by the Staff Regulations.

More precisely, you can lodge a complaint on the basis of Article 90(2) of the Staff Regulations within 3 months as from the date of the note informing you of the decision, i.e. note Ares(2018)3799365 dated 17 July 2018.

Your complaint should be sent to Unit HR.E.2's functional mailbox (HR-MAIL-E2@ec.europa.eu). It should include a description of your claims, a copy of the challenged decision and all supplementary information that you deem necessary. Your complaint will then be registered and dealt with by this unit.
