Why?

Children in need are the concern of parents, professionals, policy makers, society, and last but not least of the children themselves. Children who are in need and children who cause serious problems are entitled to protection and help.

What is the future of child protection? In 1905, legislation on children and young people entered into force in the Netherlands: a law concerning the removal of parental authority, a juvenile justice act, and a law on child protection measures. In the same period, similar laws came into force in other European countries. The Century of the Child, declared by Ellen Key, had just begun.

One hundred years later it is time for retrospection, for reflection and a new perspective. The Convention on the Rights of the Child is a recent international instrument with standards and procedures that form the basis for the protection of children. During the conference there will be an exchange of ideas, experiences, solutions and visions, concerning the past and the future, between East and West and North and South. The conference will be a breeding ground for new ideas, good practices and promising perspectives.
